The following is a list of qualities and shared behaviors that I have observed among the most successful, effective, and happy people in the water sector:

- 1. Faith and family are their two top priorities.
- 2. Integrity. These are reliable, honest people who keep their promises and commitments.
- 3. Healthy. They take their health and general fitness seriously.
- 4. Positive outlook. They are upbeat people and look for the good in everything.
- 5. Never complain. As a rule, they do not complain or share their woes with others.
- 6. Solution orientated. They see solutions and opportunities, not problems.
- 7. Responsible. They take immediate and full responsibility for mishaps and are generous in giving credit to others for successes.
